All regional artists are invited to enter up to two pieces of original art into the 2025 Martinis with Monet Art Expo. Martinis with Monet is a well-attended and publicized event that is the highlight of the summer season in Cranberry Township every year. This exhibit showcases the enormous skill and talent of a broad range of regional artists.

Awards: Cranberry Artists Network will provide Certificates of Excellence awards for First, Second, Third and Honorable Mentions, along with over \$1,000 in cash awards.

Registration:

- Entrance fee for up to 2 pieces of art is \$20 for members of CAN and \$25 for non-members.
- For all entries, please make the payment through our website: www.cranberryartistsnetwork.com/2025monet - PayPal or Credit Card payment accepted. Deadline is Sunday, June 22 at 8:59 p.m.
- · No registration payments will be accepted during the drop off.

Entry Regulations:

- Artists are permitted to submit 1-2 pieces of art for entry in any medium (except film or video and installations).
- Artists must be located within a 150-mile radius of Cranberry Township.
- Artwork must have been produced within the last 3 years and not have previously been shown in Cranberry Township.
- Original Artwork only (no reproductions).
- Artwork must be created entirely by the artist without the use of generative artificial intelligence tools. (e.g., DALL·E, Midjourney, Stable Diffusion, Artbreeder, etc.) where the tool contributes significantly to the final piece. Digital art created with traditional software (e.g., Photoshop, Illustrator, Procreate) where the artist maintains full manual control over the creative process is allowed.
- 2-D works must be professionally presented and ready to hang.
 No sawtooth hangers, picture wire and mounting hardware securely attached to frame only, not the backing. Pieces with unsecure wiring will be rejected at drop-off (see next page).
- Size limitations 36" W x 50" H including frame. Please note: these dimensions are absolute, artwork & frame wider than 36" will be rejected.

- Diptychs/triptychs are accepted but cannot be hung separately. Size limitations – 36" W x 50" H including frames. Any artwork that does not comply will be rejected.
- 3-D works must be exhibit ready.
- The depth dimensions for sculptures, ceramics, pottery and tapestries
 must be smaller than 36". Any artwork that does not comply will be
 rejected.
- All work must have 2 registration tags attached to the back of the work upon delivery. (See page 3 of the prospectus for registration tags.)
- · Digital registration only.
- Entry pictures must be in JPEG format with at least 72dpi and should not exceed 5MB.

Notification of Acceptance

 Notification of acceptance will be sent via email on or about Monday, June 30, 2025.

Drop Off:

- Accepted artwork must be dropped off to be hung on Thursday, July 3, 2025 between 4 and 7pm at the Municipal Center.
- . Artwork must hang for the duration of the show.

Pick Up:

Artwork must be picked up on Thursday, August 21, 2025 between
 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. at the Municipal Center. Artwork not picked up within the scheduled return date will be placed in storage at the artist's risk and expense. A \$25 storage fee will be assessed.
 Artworks remaining after 30 days become the property of CAN.

Disclaimer: The Cranberry Township Municipal Center is a public space. Cranberry Artists Network and the Cranberry Township Municipal Center will take reasonable precautions to prevent damage, theft or loss of artwork, but will not be held responsible for the aforementioned. By submitting artwork into the show, the artist agrees to these terms.

Sales: Cranberry Artists Network will conduct all sales during the exhibition. Artists retain 80% of the sale. Cranberry Artists Network retains the right to use art images for any promotional materials.

Submitting Artworks to Shows: When submitting artwork to shows, please make sure to follow the instructions in the prospectus for criteria specific to the show, such as size/weight restrictions, date of creation, etc.

Online submission of photos of artwork for jury selection: When registering artwork for jury consideration, please make sure to have clear, focused, well-framed photos of your artwork. Photos should mainly contain the artwork (crop to artwork), properly aligned.

Artwork drop-off: These guidelines must be followed when dropping-off artwork for a show:

2D pieces

- · Artwork must be ready to hang.
- Artwork must be within size limitations including frame.
- Frame is secure and clean, front and back.
- A wire must be securely attached to the actual frame, not the frame backer board.

Note: No sawtooth hangers. If artwork comes with a sawtooth hanger, it will be rejected.

These examples are unacceptable:









3D Pieces

- Artwork must be ready for display, stable and secure.
- · Artwork must be within size limitations.
- Hangable 3D work should be submitted with necessary hanging wire securely attached to the piece.
- Stands or display fixtures provided by artist (if needed).

Any submitted artwork not following the above guidelines will be rejected at dropoff.

PROSPECTUS ELIGIBILITY This exhibition is open to all visual artists aged 17 and older. The work must be original, not under instruction or from a kit. It must have been completed recently and not have been exhibited in the immediate area.

Artists agree to permit reproduction images for promotional purposes. The **Midland Arts Council jury shall have sole and final decision** on the selections and awards.

MEDIA All media in wall-hung work, measuring no more than 36" in any direction and weighing no more than 50 pounds is acceptable. Please make sure entries are properly wired for hanging.

Up to three entries per artist are permitted. Our site cannot accommodate video, installations, free-standing sculpture or crafts/works requiring pedestals.

ENTRY FEE A non-refundable **\$10 fee** for each work must be submitted or **if entering three**, **a discounted rate of \$25** is applicable for all three. Please make checks payable to the Midland Arts Council.

HAND SUBMITTED ENTRIES *Legibly* printed entry and **exhibit tags from this entry form** are required in duplicate.

Deliver to the Lincoln Park Performing Arts Center front entrance, 10th Street & Midland Avenue between 12 p.m. and 2 p.m. on Saturday, June 14. Works must be exhibition ready – suitably framed and wired for hanging. Wires should be taut and positioned across the back, one-third of the way down from the top of the work. Works on paper must be protected by Plexiglass (non-shattering acrylic glass).

SELECTION, AWARDS AND SALES A Midland Arts Council jury will select the show and set awards. Any sales inquiries will be directed to the artist involved. Due caution will be exercised in handling the work, but it is exhibited at the artists' own risk.

RETURN OF WORK All work (accepted or rejected must be picked up on Monday, July 7 between 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. at Lincoln Park Atrium. Your work will become property of the Midland Arts Council if you do not pick up during the scheduled pick-up time.

All participants will receive access to shared carving tools, water-based printmaking ink, and traditional hard linoleum. If you prefer to work with soft-cut linoleum, please bring your own. Participants should also bring their own printmaking or heavyweight paper suitable for relief printing - 8x10 max size for exchange.

creating charming summer-themed projects. Instructor Miss Brandy will guide both beginners and intermediate crocheters through engaging projects in a fun, supportive environment.

Beginner and Intermediate Levels:

- Learn essential crochet stitches: single crochet, slip stitch, double crochet and the Magic Ring.
- Create colorful crocheted bracelets
- Learn to read basic patterns and understand crochet terminology
- Make an adorable beginner-friendly Amigurumi fruit character



Treasurer

- C. Provide and receive contracts from artists who are presenting.
- D. Distribute write-ups and information about programs.
- E. The Program/Education Chair will report all information related to programs and education at CAN Board meetings.
