Registration:

- No entry fee, up to two pieces of art
- For all entries, please register through our website: <u>www.cranberryartistsnetwork.com/holiday2024</u> no later than Friday, November 8th at 8:59 p.m.

Entry Regulations:

- Only current CAN members in good standing may enter the show.
- Artists are permitted to submit 1-2 pieces of art for entry in any medium (except film or video and installations).
- Artwork must have been produced within the last 3 years and not have previously been shown in Cranberry Township.
- Original Artwork only (no reproductions).
- 2-D works must be professionally presented and ready to hang. No sawtooth hangers, picture wire and mounting hardware securely attached to frame only, not the backing. Pieces with unsecure wiring will be rejected at drop-off.
- 3-D works must be exhibit ready.
- Size limitations 16" x 20" including frame, portrait or landscape. Please note: these dimensions are absolute, artwork & frame wider than 20" will be rejected.
- Please note: These dimensions must include the frame for paintings. The depth dimensions will also apply for sculptures, ceramics, pottery and tapestries. Sculpture
 base and diameter no larger than 20". Any artwork that does not comply will be rejected.

- All work must have 2 registration tags attached to the back of the work upon delivery. (See page 2 of the prospectus for registration tags.)
- Digital registration only.
- All entries must be accompanied by a clear, focused picture of the submitted artwork.
- Entry pictures must be in JPEG format with at least 72dpi and should not exceed 5MB.

Notification of Acceptance

• Notification of acceptance will be sent via email on or about Monday, November 11, 2024

Drop Off:

- Accepted artwork must be dropped off to be hung on **Thursday, Nov. 14, 2024** between 4 and 7pm at Bottlebrush Gallery.
- Unsold artwork must hang for the duration of the show!

Pick Up:

Artwork must be picked up on Thursday, Dec. 19, 2024
between 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. at the Bottlebrush Gallery.
Artwork not picked up within the scheduled return date
will be placed in storage at the artist's risk and expense.
A \$25 storage fee will be assessed. Artworks remaining
after 30 days become the property of CAN.

Sales: Bottlebrush Gallery will conduct all sales during the exhibition. Artists retain 80% of the full asking price, Bottlebrush Gallery will retain 20%, customer will pay sales tax. Checks will be sent out at the end of the quarter. Cranberry Artists Network retains the right to use art images for any promotional materials.

Disclaimer: Bottlebrush Gallery will take reasonable precautions to prevent damage, theft or loss of artwork, but will not be held responsible for the aforementioned. By submitting artwork into the show, the artist agrees to these terms.

Submitting artworks to shows

When submitting artwork to shows please make sure to follow the instructions in the prospectus for criteria specific to the show, such as size/weight restrictions, date of creation etc.

Online submission of photos of artwork for jury selection:

When registering artwork for jury consideration please make sure to have clear, focused, well framed photos of your artwork. Photos should mainly contain the artwork (crop to artwork), properly aligned.

Artwork drop-off:

These guidelines must be followed when dropping-off artwork for a show:

2D pieces

- Artwork must be ready to hang
- Artwork must be within size limitations including frame
- Frame is secure and clean, front and back
- A wire must be securely attached to the actual frame, not the frame backer board. **Note**: No sawtooth hangers. If artwork comes with a sawtooth hanger, it will be rejected

These examples are unacceptable:











3D pieces

- Artwork must be ready for display, stable and secure
- Artwork must be within size limitations
- Hangable 3D work should be submitted with necessary hanging wire securely attached to the piece
- Stands or display fixtures provided by artist (if needed)

2024 Cranberry Artists Network Holiday Show Juror Barbara Westman, Professor of Fiber Art and Printmaking at Slippery Rock University



Ms. Barbara Westman moved to the US from Poland in 2002. She completed her education in her home country. First, she completed a BFA in Visual Communication, School of Applied Arts, Poznań, and then decided to study fine arts. She was accepted at the prestigious Academy of Fine Arts in Poznań, currently named The Magdalena Abakanowicz University of the Arts. Westman completed her dual BFA and dual MFA in Printmaking and Fiber Art there. While being a student there, she was a recipient of a four-year merit-based scholarship. She spent two years living in London, UK, attending South Thames College and gaining experience at the interior sign company where she fell in love in textiles.

Ms. Westman is a Professor of Fiber Art and Printmaking at Slippery Rock University. She engages students in creative activities stressing openness to the world beyond the studio walls: active participation in exhibitions, community projects, conferences and educational travel. In her studios she teaches students interdisciplinary approach to artmaking and looking into science, one's personal experiences and knowledge gained in other studios. Over the years she initiated and developed international artistic collaborative projects for students in Poland, Australia, Portugal, Sri Lanka, Costa Rica, China, and more. She and her students have been awarded SRU Student Faculty Research Grants, Student Research Grants and Green Fund Grants. Her students presented at National Conferences on Undergraduate Research conferences (NCUR) and were accepted at selective exhibition venues, such as Fiber Art International, triennial in Pittsburgh, Monotype Guild of New England National Student exhibition, and more.

Barbara Westman's artworks reflect interest in natural and man-made world where the richness of textures, structures and forms in our environment are her constant inspiration. Over the past years she has participated in many juried national and international shows, group shows, solo shows and presented at national and international conferences. She also was a juror for regional, national and international art exhibitions. Her artworks are in private collection in the USA, England, Germany, Italy, Egypt, Hungary, Bulgaria, Portugal, Spain, Netherlands, Poland, France, and were also aquired by Fondo Donne ad Arte/Academy of Fine Arts in Naples, Italy, Bibliotheca Alexandrina, Egypt, Penn State University, Beaver, PA, and more. Member of College Art Association CAA, Southern Graphics Council International SGCI, Mid-Atlantic Print Council MAPC and Associated Artists of Pittsburgh AAP.



E. Be present for work drop-off, sign-in and hanging.


F. Be present for work pick-up and sign-out sheet.




